REMINDER ABOUT SYNCHRONOUS E-LEARNING DAYS FOR WEATHER (ALL STUDENTS): Whenever school is canceled due to inclement weather, we will communicate one of two options. First, school could be canceled, and we will use a Flex Day to make-up the school day (See the calendar linked at the top of this update). Second, we could use a Synchronous E-Learning Day. The district will send out a message in the morning stating which option we are using. The decision is usually dependent upon how much time we know in advance. In the event of a Synchronous E-Learning Day, teachers provide live virtual classes in real time, and students need to log in and participate in the class to be counted present for attendance. We will follow the schedule we've used a few times so far this school year.
